

The Savor the Summer Series Starts May 8th

On Saturday, May 8, Ganondagan's populuar "Savor the Summer" Series will launch with two special programs.

Water Critters of Ganondagan - 9:30 a.m. - Join us to learn about watersheds and to use stream sampling nets for collecting and identifying aquatic insects to determine the health of Ganondagan's Great Brook. Nadia Harvieux and Sharon Radak, science educators from the Canandaigua Lake Watershed Association will lead this activity. Rubber boots or water shoes required. (allow 2+ hours). Participants meet at the Ganondagan Visitor's Center. This is a great event for the whole family! Limit of 20 participants.

The True Tale of Beavers at Ganondagan - 1 p.m.

Walk to the Beaver Dam with Ganondagan State Historic Site Manager, G. Peter Jemison (Seneca), and learn about the era of fur trade and the important role the beaver played. You will see a large beaver dam and the handiwork of these aquatic engineers. Arrive at Ganondagan's Visitor Center at 1 p.m. Wear

hiking shoes and bring your bottle of water. There will be some hill climbing, uneven surfaces on the trail. Limit of 25 participants. (Better for those 10 years and older).

Admission for each of these events: Friends of Ganondagan Members \$3, Member family \$10; Non-Member individuals \$5, Non-member family \$15.
